

**Packing Checklist for Presbyterian Music Camp 2019**

**Remember to pack the following items:**

**All Campers have available as you arrive**

	Lanyard for Nametag (string/gimp will be provided)

**Staff have available as you arrive**

**Clothing for all weather conditions**

	Sneakers or other sturdy shoes
	Rainproof shoes and raincoat
	Warm jacket/coat
	Swim suit and towel
	Sun hats
	Warm socks

**Bedding**

	Sleeping bag
	Blankets
	Pillow and case
	Additional padding for mattress (if desired - provided mattresses are somewhat thin)

**Personal care items**

	Towel, face cloth, soap
	Toothpaste, Toothbrush
	Shampoo, Conditioner
	Hand sanitizer
	Make-up/shaving mirror
	Sunscreen

And: Many folks like to bring their bicycles with them to camp.

Notes: Food for young (fussy) eaters or persons with special diets can be left in a designated area in the main dining hall if it is in a well labelled plastic tub or other similarly animal proof container. Refrigerator space is available for baby needs and those with special dietary needs.

**For Workshops & Worship**

	One candle in a holder for each family
	Bible
	Notebook and pencils or pens
	Any sheet music you may want to use
	Hymn books and other songbooks
	Musical instruments
	Music stand
	Laptop computer (if required)

**First Aid supplies**

	Bug repellent
	Sunscreen
	Salve for bites and sunburns
	Band-Aids
	Personal medications

**Be sure to label everything well so any lost item can be quickly returned.**

**Other necessary/useful items**

	<b>Your Camper Handbook</b>
	Flashlights and batteries or lantern (some prefer this for reading in cabin)
	Clothesline and pegs
	Coffee mug
	Refillable Water bottles
	Lawn chairs / camping chairs
	Board Games (for Free Time and Free night)
	Children's toys (sand box toys if you have young children)
	Clothes and props for Variety Night (if you already have an act in mind)
	Oil or WD40 for door hinges
	Metal container or hard shell sealed cooler " <b>animal-proof container</b> " (for temporary storage of snacks in cabin) <i>NOTE: Tupperware has been proven to <b>not be animal-proof.</b></i>
	Money for Tuck Shop
	extra pair of shoes & socks
	Toilet paper (if you prefer > 1 ply)
	Ear plugs (for light sleepers)

Also: There is electricity in each cabin, so items such as hairdryers, CPAP machines and electric kettles can be used.
